CLASSES TEAM A New Scheduling Plan Ame Ivanov

Because there were few students and many cancelled classes in the Fall period last year, we have decided to eliminate the 'sneak peek" for the fall classes. We will still schedule classes during the fall, or at any time during the year that space is available. Advertising will be done by email and newsletter. Sign-ups will continue to be electronic. Payments cannot be made at the desk. The desk will take a check and leave it for the classes team if the student cannot or will not pay on-line.

As of August 13, two classes for the fall are already on the calendar. One is full. We are working out details of a couple more classes before they are put on the schedule. The plan is to post the classes as they are received, once they are finalized and all necessary forms received.

After a few trial runs, sending the new Instructor Agreement and the W-9 via DocuSign is in place and working well. This speeds up the process and makes it less burdensome for the Instructors. We have a free, one user, DocuSign account through TechSoup.

REPORT FROM THE WEAVING GUILD

The cotton and Indigo that has been planted by Jim McKenna and Al Tate in the garden behind the Horton House this year are doing well, except that the raccoons have figured out after 2 years that seeds are inside the cotton balls. So they have been climbing the fence and decimating some of the plants trying to get to the seeds.

All of the seeds from the cotton crop last year have been removed from last year's crop of cotton by the guild members, and it is waiting to be taken to the John C. Campbell Folk School in August where one of our members will learn how to spin it.

Three members of the Arts Association went to a workshop in Savannah at Oatland where the Fiber Guild of Savannahs has a dye garden. They harvested Indigo leaves, soaked them in ice and water, put them in the blender, and put cotton, wool, organic silk and mulberry silk fabric squares in it. After rinsing the indigo leaves off they saw that the color left was a light green/blue, different hues depending on the fabric. This is a method that can be used with the indigo from our garden. Although you don't get the beautiful dark blue color that you get when you create an indigo vat, it is pretty and much easier and faster to do.

In October two of our guild members are participating in an Indigo dyeing workshop at Glynn Visual Arts. This will help us understand more about the creation of an Indigo vat, and the result will be the dark blue color that you think of when you think of Indigo.

The Weaving Guild is gearing up for a busy fall. In September the board of the Fiber Guild of the Savannahs is coming to Jekyll for a working retreat. They are offering our guild a spinning workshop on the Saturday afternoon of their weekend here. There is a lot of interest in this workshop, and we are excited to learn more.

During the summer members of our guild presented a lunch and learn about weaving at Glynn Visual Arts as part of their effort to learn what interests their members have in different art forms. Two of these in weaving were offered during the summer, and they are hoping to generate interest in weaving among their members.

You may notice a theme here: collaboration between neighboring guilds. We can do more together than we can separately. We appreciate their willingness to work together with us.

We are offering three classes before Thanksgiving:

Beginning Weaving on a Floor Loom Next Steps in Weaving: Overshot Beginning Rigid Heddle Loom

We already have a roster for these classes and are excited to share what we know with those who are eager to learn.

DESCRIPTION

Overshot is a beautiful weave structure with thousands of pattern possibilities. It is woven with two shuttles, one a thin thread that is the same as your warp and the other is a thicker pattern thread. The thin thread or Tabby thread weaves plain weave beneath your Pattern thread making this a very sturdy weave structure suitable for table linens, pillows, shawls and fabric.

PREREQUISITES

You must be able to wind a warp and thread the loom with minimal guidance.

NOTES

Our project will be to make a table runner using the Overshot pattern of your choice. Supply cost is waived if you provide your own yarns.

LOCATION
