

Just a few reminders:

- —If you are a member of the pottery guild or weaving guild, you must also be a member of JIAA.
- —If you are a member of a group associated with JIAA, such as the Jekyll Singers, the knit ting group, or the writers group, you must also be a member of JIAA.
- —If you want to take a class, you must first be a member of JIAA. Classes can fill up fast, and waiting until the last minute might result in missing the class you wanted.
- —If you want to sell in The Shop, you must be a member of JIAA. The automated system we use to pay artists when their works sell will not work unless the database identifies you as a member.
- —The JIAA Arts Festival is only a bit over 5 months away. In order to enter into the compe tition, you must have been a member for at least 3 months. This is a good time to be sure you won't be turned away from competing.

There are several ways to pay your dues. They are still just \$30 per year. The easiest and quickest way is online at our website, jekyllartists.org, using PayPal. You can also pay at the front desk at Goodyear Cottage, but it may take a week or more before your membership is completed in the database. If you have questions, just give me a call.

The saying goes, "When life hands you lemons, make lemonade." Recently I received a boxcar full of lemons, named Dupuytren's Constricture. A gift from my Viking ancestors. This causes the fascia in your hands to knot and cord, constricting hands into fists. So, I needed help with the lemons.

Thanks to Cathy Miller's beautiful work and two of my best students, Barbara Polonic and Dr. Michelle DeHaven, there are enough baskets to fill the Gallery, along with Deanna Brown's exquisite paintings.

Most of my thanks has to go to Dr. Michael Sullivan, my hand surgeon. Being an artist who can no longer make art is discouraging and I was ready to give up. But Dr. Sullivan told me "I don't want you to quit.." So literally with one hand tied behind my back, I kept on making baskets.

My most beautiful basket to date is named The Sullivan Experience. It took over five months to complete.

All artists seek to beautify the world around them with their art. Whether you paint, weave, write, sculpt, carve, sew, or make music, an artist will overcome the adversities they encounter. We need to create. We need to express. We need to share our passions with others. Our talents are on loan from God and can be recalled at any time.

Now go make something!

Barbara Poloncic Pine Needle Basketry

I grew up in Macon, Georgia. Thanks to my grandmother and mother, I was involved in sewing and crafts at a very young age. Have you ever made a potholder using a thread spool with nails?

My profession was banking. Even with long hours and a family, I continued creative endeavors like ceramic painting, door wreaths, and counted cross stitch. I was, and still am, more craft orientated than artistic. My best friend and I would attend craft fairs and we often remarked, upon seeing an item we liked, "we can do that".

Soon after moving to Jekyll Island, I discovered Jekyll Island Arts Association. I took a class in pine needle basketry taught by Sue Zoerb. In that class, we learned to coil, binding pine needles with raffia using a basic stitch. Next came a class taught by Linda Lanter, a renowned basket maker. This class emphasized the creative side by using artificial sinew in many different colors, different stitches, and elaborate designs.

Mrs. Lanter is an inspiration, and I am honored to exhibit my basketry items in this exciting show. I am looking forward to her next class with Jekyll Island Arts
