IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR MERRY ARTISTS

We are looking forward to another exciting Merry Artists Show and Sale.

Intake for Merry Artists Begins this week. Here are some Important Reminders

Input of information for tags closes Wednesday, November 20th

Intake is Saturday and Sunday, November 23 and 24 in the Goodyear Kitchen. There will be a check in desk where you will be asked to sign a form giving permission for images of your work to be used on our Social Media posts. We will be photographing the shows going forward and the JIAA Attorney advised we have signed releases. There is no limit to how many pieces you may enter **EXCEPT FOR POTTERY, WALL ART AND JEWELRY**.

WALL ART IS LIMITED TO 5 PIECES WHICH MUST HAVE WIRE HANGERS - Wall art drop off is Sunday, the 24th 9-3 and Monday the 25th, 9-12

POTTERY IS LIMITED TO 20 PIECES - Label scanning for POTTERY ONLY is Friday November 22nd. Please note special intake instructions which were shared earlier. Drop off is Sunday the 24th 1-3 and Monday the 25th 9-12

JEWELRY IS LIMITED TO 20 PIECES - Jewelry will be scanned in and the ARTIST will take their items to the second floor, put the items on displays (if they aren't already on displays) and leave them upstairs

Once we get past the first week we will reopen Intake. Please monitor your inventory and sales. You may replenish as you wish. Intake will be Mondays and Thursdays just like normal shop operations.

There is a Bake Sale to benefit the Campus Expansion Fund. The Bake Sale is Friday December 6th through Sunday December 8th. Drop off of Baked Goods is Friday December 6th from 9-12 and Saturday and Sunday from 10-12 in the Goodyear Kitchen.

Here We Grow! Beverly Hopkins

Expansion: "an act of increasing or making something increase in size" You may have heard that the Arts Association is working on a "Campus Expansion". It is true! There are times we lack enough classrooms to accommodate all our classes. That combined with a need to get the pottery studio out of the frequently wet basement that is inaccessible to many led us to look for additional space. The project was previously called the "pottery guild relocation". It is a project that will benefit the Association as a whole and we now call it the Campus Expansion. I hear that the weavers are already making plans for yarn dying in the backyard!

In the spring of 2023, the Jekyll Island Authority made us an offer we couldn't refuse. The JIA offered to lease the Arts Association a portion of the old fire station once the emergency services moved into the new Public Safety building on Shell Road. We are getting closer to this becoming a reality. The new building has its first occupants, and the firemen expect to move in late December.

In leasing this new space, the Arts Association will gain accessible classroom/meeting space and be able to have a pottery studio that is dry and all on ground level. Goodyear will remain our primary home, and the Pottery Guild will continue to be an active part of the Arts Association. Potters will be happy to put away their rubber boots!

For us to use the space, updates specific to the Arts Association must be made and that will take time and funding. A team of Association members has been studying the soon to be repurposed space and working with a contractor to determine the amount and cost of the work. We have been quietly setting aside funds raised by the potters and the Arts Association Board has approved the allocation of an existing capital fund for this project. More information about the fund-raising need will be going out to the membership soon.

We are grateful for the ongoing support of the Jekyll Island Authority and look forward to continuing our relationship.



The JIAA Board of Directors is comprised of fifteen voting members who each serve a three-year term. Each year the terms of five Board Directors expire, and five new Directors are elected in early December prior to a virtual Annual Meeting.
